The Problem



Invisible disabilities are disabilities that go unnoticed due to the lack of physical cues and individuals with these disabilities tend to keep their hardships to themselves. Attention Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder is an example of an invisible disability. Individuals with ADHD often do not get the appropriate support, despite being protected under ADA. This is because, like many invisible disabilities, ADHD is misunderstood and overlooked.

What is ADHD?

Attention-Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder is a neurological disorder that affects a person's executive function of their brain. The executive function of the brain is responsible for a person's mental skills such as memory, planning, or self-control. It has 3 main types: inattentive, hyperactive, and combined.








The Users


Using the funds from CHADD, Sibley will help with the development of the information center, programs, and curriculum. Since the organization works on several projects, financial assistance will be limited.


Create a distraction-free school. Support the student's mental health. Encourage healthy habits.

Incorporate natural elements in classrooms, the library, and focus rooms to enhance productivity.

Gott's Hierarchy of ADHD Needs



Create spaces where students can reset and destress. Allow spaces where the students can express their creativity.

Precedent Study Findings

- Include specialty services for the students that cater to their well-being and mental health, such as a sensory room
- Many students feel more secure carrying their belongings with them rather than storing them in a locker
- Provide spaces that the students can hang out and socialize both indoors and outdoors
- Wide corridors are crucial to avoid becoming crowded as students switch classes
- Several teachers mentioned not having enough space to store supplies
- Flexible seating in the classrooms can make it easier to adjust according to the lesson plan or activity






Mind Map







Help build and maintain the students' mental and physical health. Especially helping improve the selfesteem and mood of the students.



Create a <u>distraction-free</u> environment for the students, including private areas for the students to decompress and study independently.



Include opportunities for the students to <u>socialize</u> inbetween classes and spaces for extra-curricular activities.



Inform the students, parents, faculty, and other community members about ADHD.



There will be a <u>sensory room</u> to allow students to regulate their behavior. There will be a <u>nutritionist</u> and a <u>gym</u> to improve the students' physical health.



Classrooms and similar spaces will have <u>soothing colors</u> and <u>lighting</u>. Acoustic strategies will also be implemented to <u>minimize excess noise</u>.



Students will be able to socialize in the <u>courtyard</u> or the <u>seating areas</u> in the hallway. The fourth floor will have <u>spaces for clubs and extra-curricular activities.</u>



There will an <u>ADHD center</u> on the first floor that is open to the public.






Original Plan


The check-in desk was designed with a curvilinear profile and a blue tile referencing the well-known Mississippi River that runs throughout the state.









Display Case

Since students are using less and less lockers over time, display cases for the students' work or trophies fill the hallways instead of lockers.












Reflected Ceiling Plan






